



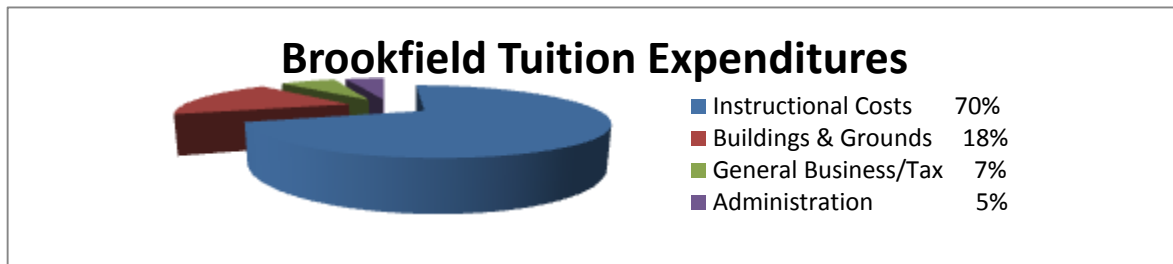
GENERAL SCHOOL INFORMATION MAIN CAMPUS 2011-2012

MISSION/VISION: Brookfield School provides a setting where young people prosper in thought and imagination, in competence and character, as individuals, and as members of a school community. Brookfield School is committed to the overall development of each child. To this end we provide strong academic instruction in the basic skills as well as a wide variety of cultural and aesthetic experiences within a success oriented program.

Brookfield School will continuously be engaged in developing the model school of academic excellence dedicated to student safety, responsibility, empowerment and the democratic process. We envision a place where every student feels successful. From this feeling of success, comes motivation and a love of lifelong learning.

Brookfield School fully subscribes to and practices a policy of nondiscrimination admission and enrollment. No applicant or enrolled student shall be discriminated against because of religion, sex, disability, race, national or ethnic origin. Brookfield School is licensed by the Nevada Department of Education and Nationally Accredited with NIPSA (National Independent Private School Association).

TUITION: We understand by September 6th you have paid August and September tuition and consumables. Tuition is based on the 180 day school calendar, not a monthly allocation. Brookfield is solely tuition funded. Tuition pays for Teachers' salaries, building overhead, and capital improvements on the properties. Tuition is divided into ten equal payments August through May.



Please remember, our school depends on adult volunteerism for all programs. We appreciate any time donated to the school! We consider parent time a significant non-financial contribution.

CONSUMABLES/ENRICHMENT FEES: The Main Campus fee supports the extras students will get throughout the school year. Specialty Instructional Costs for both the teachers and supplies include: Art, Music, Physical Education, Foreign Languages, Curriculum, Instructional Materials, Workbooks, Science, Accelerated Reader, Early Literacy, standardized testing for every student.

OPTIONAL STUDENT ACCIDENT INSURANCE: If your child needs coverage, student accident insurance is optional at \$100.00 for the year. This medical coverage will pay for any injury to the child during the school day. The insurance enrollment period is during the month of September only. This item can be added to your bill, or make a check clearly marked for insurance payable to "Brookfield School."



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MAIN CAMPUS DAILY DRESS CODE AND UNIFORMS: Used uniforms will be for sale starting at the Parent Pre-First Party and Parent Reception and continuing in Great Room til mid September. Students are asked to comply with the dress code as soon as possible.



- Uniforms will be worn on Wednesdays and on **ALL** field trips.
- Wednesday uniforms for boys are navy pants/shorts with white collared shirts.
- The Girls' Wednesday uniform dress/skirt/skirt can be ordered from Dennis Uniform Company at dennisuniform.com (our school code is WOPBRO, or use the link from our web page).
- A catalog is available in the office to explain the different uniforms by grade. An additional uniform option for upper grade girls is a gray skirt and wine colored polo from Dennis Uniform.
- All sweatshirts or sweaters worn on campus must be red or navy.
- Shoes should have closed toes. Sandals and high heels are not allowed.
- Heavy coats worn outside can vary in color.
- Students must follow our dress code on all non-uniform days:
 - Navy or khaki pants or shorts with a solid red, white, or navy collared shirt. Skirts/shorts must cover the lower torso with no skin showing between your top and skirt.
 - Skirts/shorts must be at least mid-thigh in length: no short skirts, and no exposed undergarments.

BEFORE / AFTER SCHOOL ENRICHMENT PROGRAMS: Teacher Supervised Homework Clubs held Monday - Thursday are available to all students after school. Homework Clubs are part of after school care. Our Spanish Immersion program will be held Monday through Thursday after school, and our Violin program for 1st and 2nd Grade students will be offered in the mornings. Other enrichment programs include: "Brookfield Choraliers," Tae Kwon Do, "Kidscape Drama," Chinese, Lego Club, Astounding Art, Math Club, Robotics, Tennis, and "Tumble Bus Gymnastics." Private music instruction is also available. All are welcome to come and try the classes free on the first day they are offered. Sign up forms will be available at the Parent Reception on the first day of school and in the office thereafter.

PTA FAMILY MEMBERSHIP: If you are wondering how to become involved in your child's school year, joining the PTA is a great beginning. Minimum membership costs \$20.00 per family. Higher levels of membership can be purchased. The PTA is very important to our Brookfield community. They meet monthly and do so many wonderful things to benefit your child and the classrooms. They volunteer time to run many fun school events. PTA charges are **NOT** on your August bill, and payment is your choice. Please issue a separate check for PTA annual dues made out to "**Brookfield PTA.**"

MILK / CATERED HOT LUNCH PROGRAM: You may order milk for \$0.60 a day, or \$108.00 annually. This can be added to your Brookfield bill. N&M Vizion, Inc. will be providing the Hot Lunch program again this year. Information is included in your packet. Please order form N&M Vizion, Inc. the week prior to receive hot lunch.

MAIN CAMPUS MATH LAB AND READING LAB PROGRAM: We will have math and reading labs again this year! Details, costs, and schedules are to be announced. Both our Reading and Math Labs are small classes offered to selected students. Any students wishing to participate will have to meet our entrance requirements. Limited enrollments are available.
